The Downtown Surrey Business Improvement Association (DSBIA) commissioned Roslyn Kunin & Associates to complete a study on the economic benefits of a medical school. The findings show that a medical school in Downtown Surrey would contribute \$159.9 million to the provincial GDP on an annual operational basis – amounting to \$3 billion over 20 years and supporting 1,800 jobs.

For capital costs for the Medical School, findings estimated \$864,000 in GDP contribution to the provincial economy, 8 jobs supported and \$212,000 government tax revenue for every \$1 million of capital costs – for example, a \$10 million construction project would bring almost \$9 million in GDP contribution towards for the provincial economy, support 80 jobs and generate over \$2 million in tax revenue in a year. Notably, the medical school would also draw out-of-province visitor spending, the report said, generating \$127,000 in tax revenue for B.C. for every \$1 million of visitor spending.

"Excluding the above qualitative benefits, a Surrey Medical School will produce hundreds of millions of dollars each year and billions of dollars over the life of the facility," the report concluded, adding that the BIA should make "every effort... to encourage the approval of funding and establishment of an SFU medical school featuring distributed practise in central Surrey."

SFU's page on the progress of the project remains at "internal community engagement" – only the second in seven steps (with "proposed medical school announced" as the only completed step preceding it). The website noted that "internal community engagement" was completed this spring.

Officials have yet to begin five following steps: External community engagement, analysis of accreditation process, preliminary curricular model, costing analysis and vision for the school itself.

The school would be partnered with both Fraser Health and the First Nations Health Authority, according to SFU. Currently, the school says it expects to welcome its first class within four years.

In a statement, DSBIA CEO Elizabeth Model said it is crucial for the project to go ahead – not only for Surrey itself, but for the province at-large.

"While the focus of the report is on the economics associated with a medical school, we also need to be mindful of the major impact it would have on health outcomes by training more health professionals, creating greater access to primary care and helping to address some of the critical challenges facing our acute care system," Model said in her statement.

Renewal

A few of our current and past directors at the Extraordinary General Meeting with CEO, Elizabeth Model.

Over the past twenty years, the DSBIA has operated on five-year terms. This most recent renewal included a proposal that the term be extended to seven years, rather than five years. This extension follows trends of best practice among other BIAs — reducing costs of renewal, more efficiently utilizing staff hours and resources, and providing greater stability for the association to engage in longer term planning.

The renewal process worked to engage the business community, so that the DSBIA may continue planning and operating in a manner that best serves our members. In 2021, DSBIA staff and Board of Directors revised the Strategic Plan as the first step of the renewal process. Beginning in January 2022, the DSBIA engaged in a two-month long renewal survey campaign, during which members were given the opportunity to complete a comprehensive survey designed to ascertain business priorities. This information would be essential for creating a budget for the coming term that accurately reflected the needs and wishes of the members.

Thirty-six questions were employed to focus on priority levels for different DSBIA initiatives. A single question asking if respondents supported the continuation of the DSBIA under a renewed seven-year mandate found 94.19% support for the continuation of DSBIA for another seven years.

Armed with information gathered during renewal surveys, DSBIA staff drafted new budget proposals — three of which were taken to the DSBIA Finance Committee with chanages, they chose on budget to take membership for approval.

The DSBIA Management Committee and the full Board of Directors presented the proposed financial budgets to membership over five renewal meetings. Three meetings were organized, with breakfast, lunch, and evening options included to ensure all businesses would have an opportunity to attend. An additional breakfast time was arranged, as well as an evening virtual meeting allowing members to provide their unique perspectives, and additionally serving as community building opportunities.

On July 20th, 2022, the DSBIA held its Extraordinary General Meeting at City Centre Library. At the meeting, the Board of Directors were present to discuss member concerns and answer questions. At the meeting, all three proposed motions were passed: providing the DSBIA with a seven-year mandate, adopting the proposed levy strategy, and approving the proposed budget for 2023.

The final steps of renewal lie with the City of Surrey. City staff will go over documentation and contact property owners, informing them of renewal intentions. In February 2023, Surrey City Council will approve (or disprove) the renewal. Should all go as expected, the new DSBIA term is slated to begin April 1st, 2023.





The Community Conversations series will continue in the fall, so stay tuned for more events.




